Everyone has the Right to Move, to Stay and to Go, wherever they want.

The german state and its anti-migration laws is an oppressive system. It tries to cut off the Self Determination of everyone, but especially of Refugees and Migrants. Refugee camps, residence restrictions, payment cards and deportations are discrimination and structural violence.

We believe in the Power of People. We create networks and spaces of Solidarity and Humanity, accessible for everyone. Spaces where exploitation, privilege and hierarchies of power are broken down together. We fight against discriminations of race, gender, sexuality, beliefs or ability. We beat state oppression and exploitation by organising ourselves and taking care of each other.

Berlin is a city where People from all around the world find place to live and survive. Still, it is hard to find places for your basic needs or communities.

This booklet lists resources for easier access to networks and spaces that (mostly) don't collaborate with state authorities.

Also, it shares some basic information about our human rights and successful experiences we have made to fight for them.

We encourage you to always speak up for your rights and the rights of others.

We will stand with you.

RIGHT Basic Rights MOVE

When you interact with the police, you have the right to remain silent. You have a right to not cooperate (passively!) and to not give your signature, for example if you have been searched. police have the right to ask for your ID (Ausweis). If police confiscate your belongings, ask for documentation. After, write a protocol of what happened.

Racial profiling is illegal. *KOP* (https://kop-berlin.de) deals with police practice of racial profiling, documentation of racist police assaults, accompany victims and referrals to counselling centres

Freedom of Movement within germany is sometimes restricted. Look on your ID for a "räumliche Beschränkung". In the first three months of an asylum process, or a duldung, your Freedom of Movement is restricted to your place of registration (anmeldung). After three months, you are free to travel within germany, but you may still have a "wohnsitzauflage", which restricts where you can officially live.

If you have no stable place to live you are allowed to receive post to the address of emergency shelters (check the network kaeltehilfe-berlin.de)



If you have received cuts to your money, we encourage you to visit a legal counselling (RLC, KUB, BBZ). A letter to bamf appealing your individual case will often reduce the cuts. No matter your asylum process (subsidarschutz, duldung (lite)), everyone has the right to a minimum amount of money for survival.

Living 'sans-papier' - without documents - is less tolerated in germany than in other countries. As everywhere, unofficial work still exists. Online, Ebay Kleinanzeigen has many job offers. Ask someone to help you write applications. Take care with exploitation.

Support Groups can help to organise Soli-Events to raise money. Visit to No Border Assembly's Kufa on Fridays to learn more.

If you are in an Asylum process: After three months, you have the right to work. You need to fill in some forms with your employer and get approval from the foreigner's office (auslanderbehorde)

After the suicide of the Iranian refugee Muhammed Rahsapar at the refugee-camp in Würzburg, refugees from all around Germany united and set off to Berlin in a protest-march. Starting from Würzburg, they covered 600 km in a month. Visits to refugee camps along the way exposed the isolation of refugees, and they invited them to leave their camps and to join our march.

When they arrived in Berlin they set up a protest camp at Oranienplatz in Kreuzberg. These tents symbolise to society the problems - they reject the isolation and discriminative laws the German state is trying to impose on them, that they raise their voices and are resisting. This protest camp soon become their center of resistance, the place where they made their political demands visible.

Starting from Oranienplatz they organized a bus-tour to different "Lagers" in other German cities in 2013. Even thought they faced a lot of repression and violence by police, they were able to get in contact with many refugees living in isolation, some joined them on the way or came to the big demonstration in Berlin.

Winter arrived and they occupied an old school building in Ohlauer Straße. The snow had crashed their meeting-tent right over their heads and especially families needed a warm place to stay.

In 2014 they brought the protest to the European level: In a march from Strasbourg to Brussels they broke the international borders in an act of civil disobedience together with refugee-activist from various regions.

For more than two years they organized many demonstrations and activities from the base of resistance: Oranienplatz and Ohlauer Straße. Through different kinds of direct action, such as civil disobedience, occupations and blockades they made clear that we will not stop to fight for our rights. We connected our protest with other struggles and groups like anti-gentrification and antifa-groups, workers,

students and artists

Within the last two years they have achieved that refugees are part of the political discussion and that they appear on the political agenda. Their biggest success by now is the fact that they have overcome the life in isolation that was imposed on them, and that a collective and more united life has started to grow on the streets. They take their freedom, cross borders and design their lives the way they want.

The resistance that started with a small number of people has become a broad movement. More and more refugees in different regions of germany organize themselves and protest against the discriminative asylum system.

You can find all different groups, from the ones fighting for many years already to newly emerging groups, on www.oplatz.net, in "other groups".

"We have found support from society. A historical resistance was realized against the attacks on the occupied school at Ohlauer Straße. For over 9 days thousands of police officers did not manage to enter the school. In the end they had to give up their siege and left the place to us. Despite the districts attempts to evict the building, some refugee activists keep resisting in the building. We demand that we can keep the building and transform it into a self-organized

International Refugee Center, a center run by refugees for refugees.

Our experience has taught us that the parliament and political parties don't want to solve our problems. Far from it! By passing laws against us, they drive us into a captives' life. We find our only certainty on the streets. There is no alternative to fighting on the streets. Only on the streets we have the potential to build up a different, a united and collective life."

updating & feedback

Our social systems are changing quickly in germany. fascism is normalised and Community Organising is repressed.

So far, it's confirmed that budget cuts in 2025 will, and have forced, a lot of state-dependant resources to close.

We remind ourselves, the revolution will not be funded.

One difficulty of creating this brochure is keeping the information upto-date.
